Political Aims

Global Justice

We can only fight global crises globally! That is why we need a development policy that is consistently oriented towards human rights and the 1.5 degree target. I fight for a post colonial and feminist development policy. We need a global structural policy!

Climate justice: The climate crisis is also a question of global justice. Because climate change hits the people hardest who are least responsible for it. Women, children, the elderly and marginalized groups in countries and regions of the Global South are particularly affected. For me it is clear: Climate justice needs global and social justice!

Globally just development policy

The impact on the Global South must be factored into all political action, for example through a human rights MOT („Menschenrechts-TÜV“) and a comprehensive supply chain law.

2. Decolonize international cooperation

Colonial structures in international cooperation must be ended. For breaking up post colonial structures in culture, politics and science!

03. Globally just climate policy

We need an international climate policy that does justice to our historical and present responsibility and is sensitive to post colonial structures. We can only fight the climate crisis together!

04. Feminist development cooperation and foreign policy

Women, inter and trans persons must have a say not only in peace and climate agreements. Their perspectives must always and everywhere be considered and included in all decisions.

05. No human being is illegal!

Instead of misusing development funds to block refugee routes, we must fight for a humane refugee policy in Europe and beyond.

06. More civil crisis prevention

For proactive conflict prevention, e.g. by ending food and water speculation, and more human and financial resources for civil crisis prevention.

Anti-fascism

Right-wing extremism, racism and anti-Semitism are the greatest dangers to democracy. The right-

wing extremist terrorist attacks in Hanau, Kassel and Halle show that we must consequently combat right-wing extremism and dismantle right-wing networks. We need a strong civil society and institutional anti-racism. Anti-fascism - always and everywhere!

1. Not a millimetre to the right!

For a world in which hatred and agitation have no place neither on the net nor in the tram, and in which every misanthropic statement is met with resolute opposition.

02. Social & political participation for everyone

For structures that promote diversity and social and political participation. We need more innovative participation formats and voting rights from 16.

03. Strong civil society

Initiatives, that promote democracy, anti-racism and anti-fascism must be institutionally strengthened. For a strong civil society we need a democracy promotion law („Demokratiefördergesetz“) and a reform of the non-profit status („Gemeinnützigkeit“).

04. Anti-racism in our security agencies

An independent police complaints office is needed, as well as regular studies on racism in the police. Our security agencies need to be reformed!

Feminism

Every person should be able to freely live their own life regardless of gender identity and sexual orientation. However, the reality for women and queer people is different. Unfair pay, violence and paternalism are commonplace.

1. Self-determination for everyone

Sections 218 and 219a of the German Penal Code, as well as the Transsexual Act („Transsexuellengesetz“) need to be abolished. We need health protection for instead of criminalization of unwanted pregnant persons and doctors. My body, my choice!

02. Equal rights now!

Closing the gender pay gap, a gender check and a feminist government are overdue.

03. Half the power to women

Women make up about 50 percent of the population. I advocate for a women's quota in politics & business. The future is female!

04. Against gender-based violence

Sexualization, harassment and physical violence are omnipresent for many women and queer people in Germany. Perpetrators must be consistently held accountable, crime must be fought on the net and more safe places for women and queer people must be institutionally funded.

Federal Election

Candidacy speech

On the 26th of September the choice is ours! We need a radical policy change in Berlin. Instead of destroying our planet and reproducing global and social inequalities, it is time for a policy, that creates a more social, global and climate-just system.

For Frankfurt to Berlin

My goals for the west of Frankfurt

I want to fight with you and for you in Berlin for a Frankfurt that is driven by anti-fascism and equality and where all people can live in dignity and freedom. I want to advocate as your direct candidate in Berlin for a better tomorrow in Frankfurt.

Everything is possible!

01. Shaping international cooperation together

Together with the implementing organizations, such as the Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau (KfW) and the Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ), we must advance decolonial and feminist development cooperation.

02. Liberal drug policy

Inspired by the Frankfurt Way, we need a drug policy that focuses on health and youth protection. The lifting of the ban on cannabis, as well as a low-threshold drug-checking service, are long overdue.

03. Promoting safe harbours

Local and state efforts to take in refugees by themselves must finally be enabled and supported by the federal level. No one is illegal!

04. Housing is a fundamental right

We need more housing in Frankfurt that is family-friendly, open to all and geared towards the social environment and the common good. Federal programs must create more social and affordable housing.

In addition to my party-political involvement, I love to give political education courses, am involved in various associations, and am a passionate participant of demonstrations (at which I enjoy singing choruses even without a megaphone). And when I'm not working or involved in politics, I like to spend my moments in parks with cake, friends and a mate.

Frankfurt has become my home. Here I have also strengthened my political commitment. Since 2019, I have been the spokesperson for the GRÜNE JUGEND Hesse. I have set myself the goal of expanding the cooperation between party youth and the party and promoting dialogue between the generations, as well as the dialogue with social movements and initiatives, representing the interests of young people.
